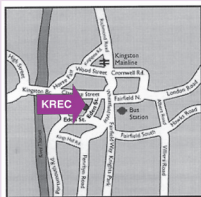

Our Mission

KREC works in partnership with individuals and organisations for a fair and just society which values diversity and gives everyone an equal chance to work, learn and live, free from discrimination, prejudice and racism

Our aims and activities

Our main aims are:

- To work towards the elimination of racial discrimination;
- To promote equality of opportunity and good relations between people of different racial and cultural groups.

KREC does this in a variety of ways:

- *Race specific casework* — ranging from individual advice and support through to representation at Employment Tribunals
- *Policy development* — working with other agencies in the borough to tackle racism at a strategic level
- *Public awareness*— using local media to raise awareness of racism, and organising cross-cultural public events
- *Community development* — supporting ethnic minority organisations by providing them with information and advice

- *Consultancy* — infrastructure and organisational support and capacity building for developing voluntary and Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) groups
- *Training* — on awareness raising, policy development and implementation of racial equality in practice.

Who uses our services?

Anyone living or working in the Royal Borough of Kingston Upon Thames experiencing racial harassment or discrimination can come to KREC for support and advice. Additionally, local community organisations and public bodies use our development, training and consultancy services.

Racists Incidents Drop In

Every Thursday from 10.30am until 12.30am KREC hosts a drop in service for people experiencing racism in Kingston.

Victims of racial harassment and discrimination can speak in confidence to representatives from various agencies — KREC, Victim Support, Kingston Police, Citizens Advice Bureau — about the problems they are suffering in order to deal with their situation quickly and effectively.

Kingston Carnival

Kingston's answer to Notting Hill

The first Sunday in September sees central Kingston come alive with the sizzling sounds, costumes and flavours of Kingston Carnival. The event has been running for over five years and showcases a variety of dancing, music and food from all corners of the globe.

Bike Across Cultures

Bringing cycling and walking to Richmond and Kingston's Ethnic Minority communities

Every June, community members from Kingston and Richmond gather in Richmond Park to share the experience of cycling, often for the first time. KREC and Richmond's Ethnic Minority Action Group (EMAG) organise this event catering for all ages and abilities. The event concludes with a picnic in the park.

Black History Month

Remembering the experiences of local Black and Minority Ethnic people in Kingston

October is the month when the stories and achievements of Ethnic Minority people are celebrated. KREC often leads on this important event and regularly runs lectures dedicated to Cesar Picton, a Senegalese slave who prospered in Kingston in the early nineteenth century.
